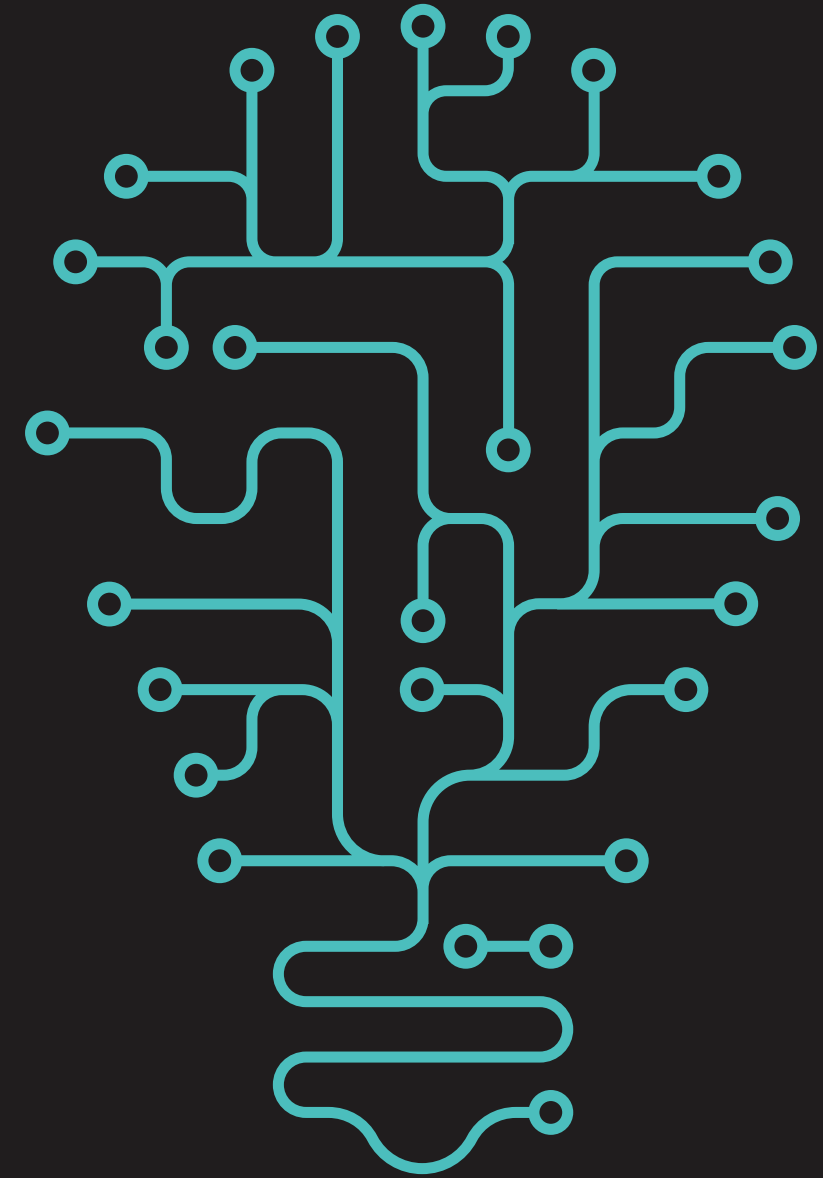

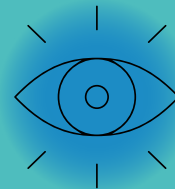


VISION AND MISSION

As part of the project “Multi-Stakeholder Cooperation for Environmental Transformation Action”, BGF organised the “Green Policy Academy”. The event brought together representatives of the 8th Legislature of the Assembly of Kosovo and civil society organisations to explore developments and challenges within the energy and environment sectors.

The Academy led by BGF’s Executive Director, Visar Azemi, was divided into three discussion sessions, each covering major themes and featuring a different speaker, including: “The Prioritisation of Green Policies in Kosovo” led by European Parliament Member, Viola von Cramon; “The Future of Renewable Energy Resources” led by the Head of the Energy Regulatory Office, Ymer Fejzullahu; and “Importance of the Green Deal, Energy and Environmental Issues” led by the vice-chair of the Energy Community Secretariat, Dirk Buschle.



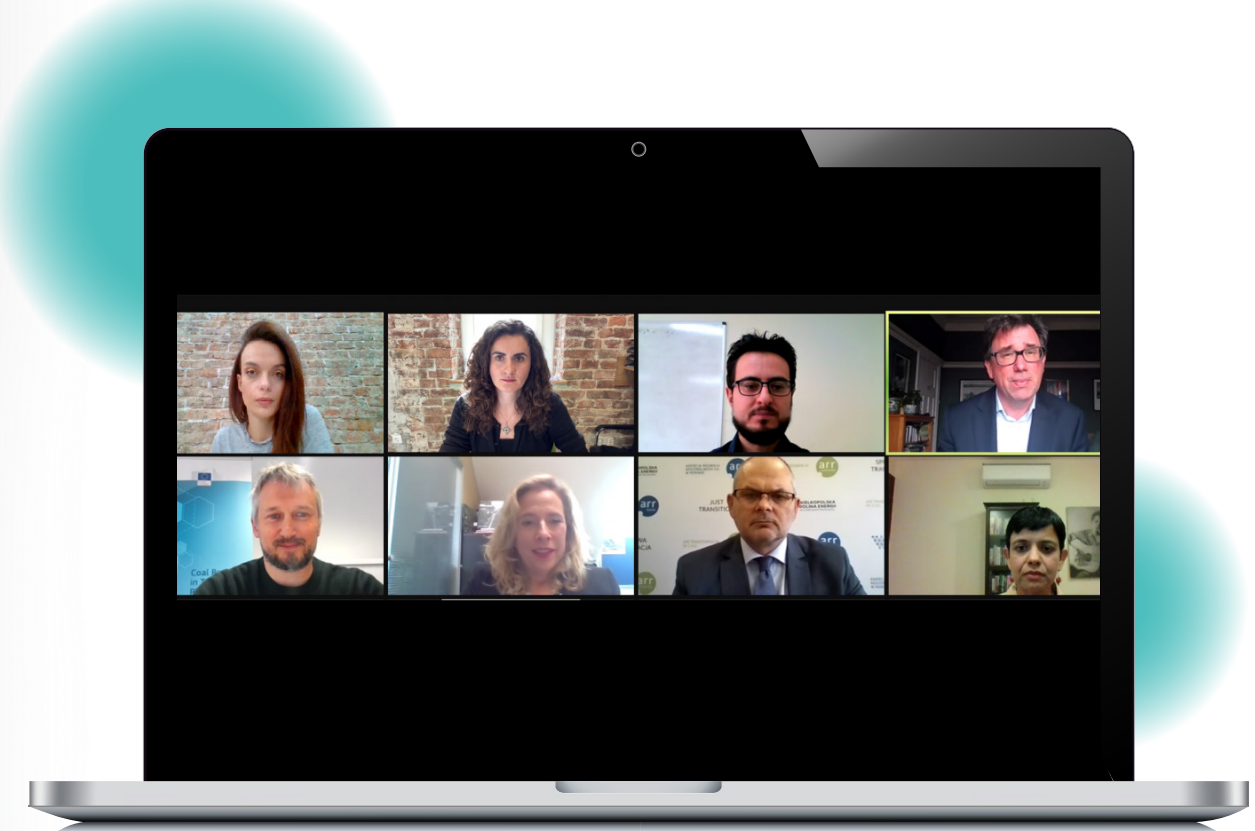
BGF PART OF COP26

The ‘COP26’ Climate Change summit brought parties together to accelerate action toward the goals of the Paris Agreement and the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change.

BGF was represented by Ms. Rinora Gojani (Programmes and Operations Manager) who was involved in the COP26 side event “Voices from the regions: sharing first-hand experiences of coal phase-out in Europe and beyond”,

together with international actors involved in post-coal transitions in various regions of the world.

Ms. Gojani emphasised the need to facilitate and support the development of new economic activities, tackle the negative impacts of mining, develop human and social capital, and improve people’s quality of life across the Western Balkans region.

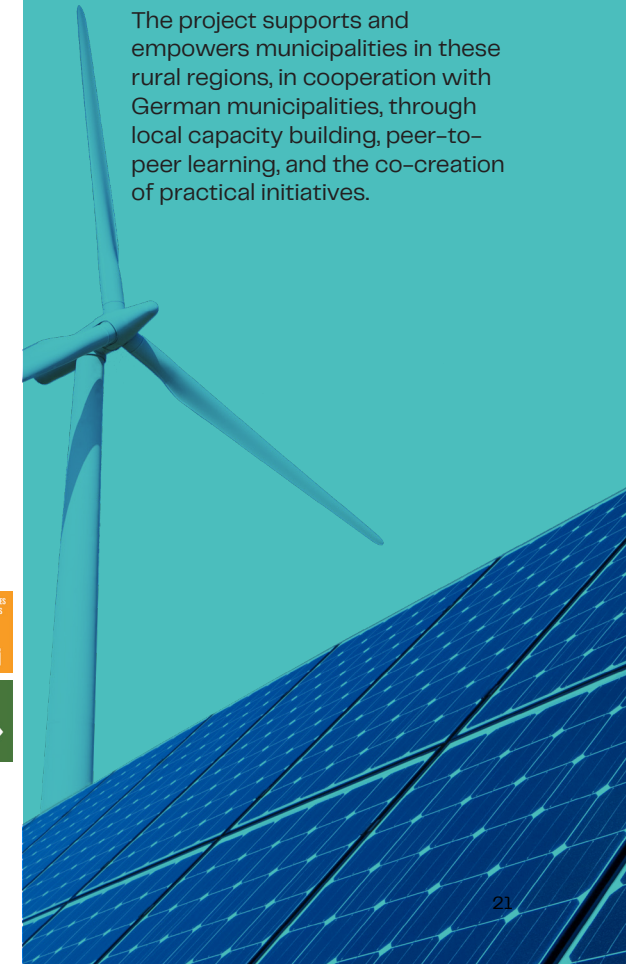

GREEN RURAL DEAL

BGF’s “Green Rural Deal – Sustainable and Smart Transition Strategies for Rural Municipalities” project aims to develop local capacities for the transition to a zero-carbon economy in three target regions: Western Macedonia (Greece), Kamenica (Kosovo), and Priboj (Serbia).

The project supports and empowers municipalities in these rural regions, in cooperation with German municipalities, through local capacity building, peer-to-peer learning, and the co-creation of practical initiatives.



MULTI-STAKEHOLDER COOPERATION FOR TRANSFORMATIVE ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION

The “Multi-Stakeholder Cooperation for Transformative Environmental Action” project aimed to intensify its work with energy and environment stakeholders, work closely with Kosovan Members of Parliament to promote the Green Deal and advocate for cleaner, more sustainable policies in the country.

GREEN CROSS

The cross-border project “Green Cross – Towards Local Green Economies with Smart Investments”, jointly implemented between the Municipality of Klina in Kosovo and Municipality of Has in Albania, aims to contribute to sustainable economic growth in the area by enabling the municipalities to transition towards a green economy through integrated policy, smart public investments, and capacity development.

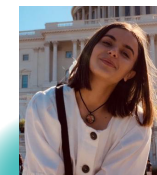

REGIONAL INCUBATOR FOR SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURS (RISE)

The “Regional Incubator for Social Entrepreneurs (RISE)” project supports young change-makers to develop impactful ideas into sustainable social businesses. It is also designed to help address the regional legacy of conflict and division by opening new spaces of reconciliation between Western Balkans youth through the cooperative pursuit of social

entrepreneurship.

The Incubation Phase of ‘RISE Journey 1.0’ was completed in February 2021, and its successful outcomes paved the way for ‘RISE Journey 2.0’ to be initiated in August 2021, offering further support for the development of young people’s sustainability initiatives.

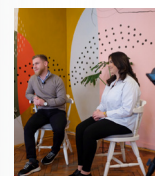

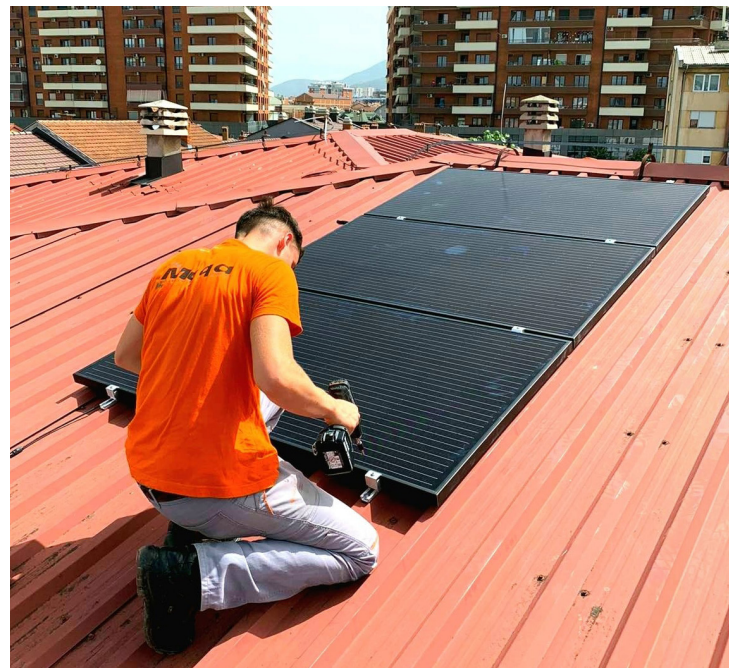
IMPROVING OUR ENVIRONMENT, CHANGING OUR FUTURE

BGF's "Improving our Environment, Changing our Future" project raised young people's awareness on the environment and climate change and encouraged their adoption of sustainable practices. Through educational workshops, participants were encouraged to brainstorm project ideas that would help make their communities more sustainable.

ENVIRONMENTAL CAPACITY BUILDING ON DATA IN KOSOVO

In the framework of the “Environmental Capacity Building on Data in Kosovo” project, BGF serves as a connecting link between the Swedish Environmental Protection Agency team and project partners at the Kosovo Environmental Protection Agency. Besides contributing

as a local administrator, BGF also contributes to research. The project aims to build environmental capacity in Kosovo and advance the EU accession process in the environmental area.

“Environmental Capacity Building on Data Use in Kosovo” project is supported by the Swedish Environmental Protection Agency.



SMARTER STOVES PARTNERSHIP

Within the “Smarter Stoves Partnership” project, BGF collected data on residential heating devices in Kosovo in support of research on “Accelerating the change-out of obsolete household heating devices in the

Western Balkans”. The project aimed to establish a regional platform for the replacement of inefficient stoves by mobilising decision-makers, international financial institutions and development partners.

“Smarter Stoves Partnership” project was a cooperation of Balkan Green Foundation and RES Foundation.



BALKANS UNITED FOR CLEAN AIR

BGF is working with 7 regional partners to realise the “Balkans United for Clean Air” campaign to raise public awareness, advocate for air pollution reductions

and quality-of-life improvements, and call on Western Balkans governments to work together towards these ends.

“Balkans United for Clean Air” campaign is supported by European Fund for the Balkans.

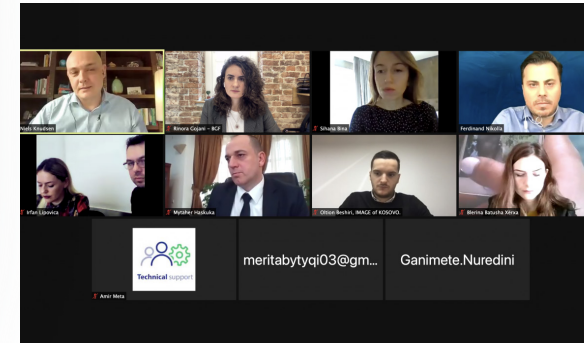


NATIONAL AND INTER-NATIONAL ADVOCACY IN 2021

DISCUSSION ON THE IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON TOURISM IN KOSOVO

The discussion highlighted the adverse effects of the virus on tourism and the need for a strategy to ensure that businesses across the tourism ecosystem can survive.

BGF representative **Ms. Rinora Gojani** made the case for a recovery strategy whose resilience is grounded in sustainable development.



DEBATING “HOW TO BOOST ECONOMIC GROWTH BY PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT”

The debate aimed to raise awareness among the public and relevant institutions on the importance of implementing laws to protect Kosovo’s environment. BGF representative **Mr. Besfort Kosova (Project Manager and Researcher)** analysed Kosovo’s experience with sustainable economic growth policies in comparison to other WB countries, and called for progress to be accelerated.

PANEL DISCUSSION AT CLIMATE DIPLOMACY WEEK 2021

The event focused on discussing three topics: “The preservation of the environment”, “Making choices on the wellbeing of current and future generation” and “Kosovo’s position within the EU Green Deal”.

BGF representative **Ms. Rinora Gojani** stressed the role of NGOs and public awareness in driving forward green policies, and suggested steps for the Government of Kosovo to fulfill Green Deal criteria in support of successful EU integration.



DISCUSSING ON “SUSTAINABLE ENTREPRENEURSHIP IN KOSOVO”

Panelists shared their experiences and ideas regarding sustainable entrepreneurship in Kosovo. BGF representative **Mr. Shpend Mustafa (Project Coordinator)** discussed the importance of institutional support for young start-ups in Kosovo and shared details of BGF’s work to foster the sustainable development ecosystem in Kosovo and beyond.



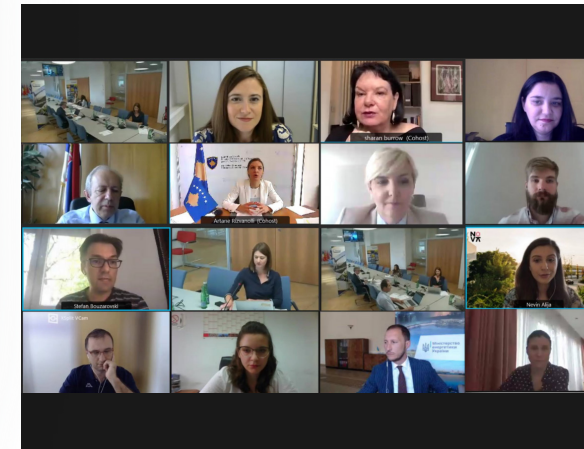
ENERGY COMMUNITY SUMMER SCHOOL (5th EDITION)

During the panel “Aspects of the Just Transition”, BGF’s **Rinora Gojani, Programmes and Operations Manager** emphasised the importance of engaging younger generations in energy transition debates and decisions, and flagged the dangers of reliance on fossil fuels.



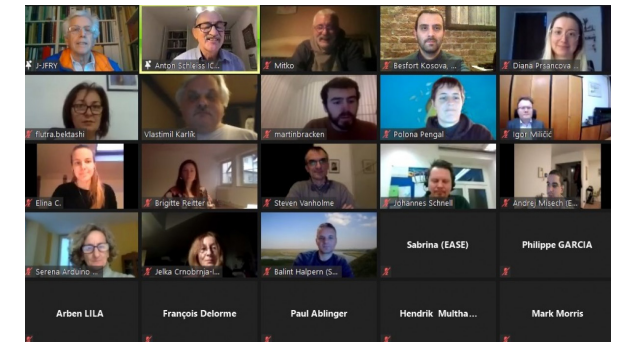
ENERGY COMMUNITY JUST TRANSITION FORUM

ROUNDTABLE ON “HYDROPOWER ENERGY IN EUROPE

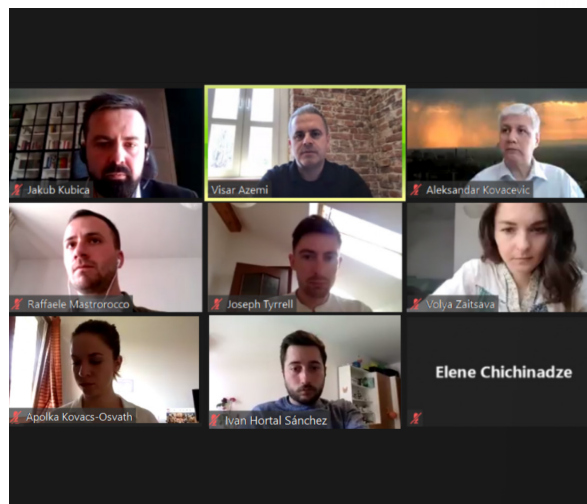
Hydropower stakeholders came together at this event with the aim of establishing an all-inclusive policy framework and research agenda on a sustainable and environmentally-friendly hydropower sector for the future. BGF’s Project Manager, **Besfort Kosova**, explained the situation in the region, and the challenges facing the WB energy sector – not least the adverse impacts attributable to unsustainable small hydropower plants.



DISCUSSING “ENERGY IN THE WESTERN BALKANS – BETWEEN DEVELOPMENT AND GEOPOLITICS”

The event aimed to provide in-depth insights to students from the College of Europe, regarding the regional energy system and the main challenges confronting WB countries, especially in the context of their European integration.

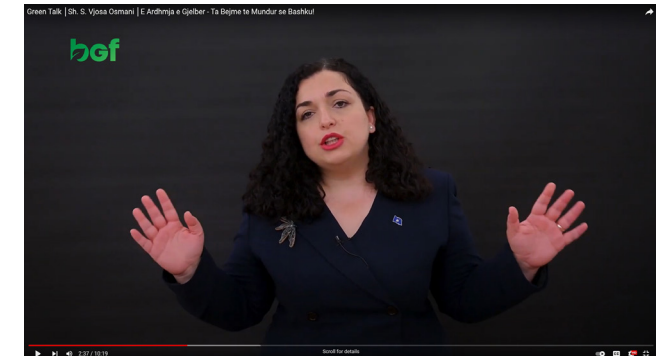

BALKAN ENERGY PROSPECT

“Balkan Energy Prospect” is among the tools created by BGF to promote public understanding of the flow of energy and its interaction with the economy and the environment. If WB countries cooperate in integrating their energy infrastructure in line with Energy Community Treaty commitments, this could increase cross-border collaboration while supporting the transition towards lower carbon economies.

With the establishment of cooperation and integrated

energy infrastructure, countries will increase cross-border collaboration, develop regional projects, and lower their carbon economy.

As such, this platform provides valuable information about six (6) WB countries in terms of their energy technologies, potential synergies for a future integrated energy market, and capacities for energy diversification within the WB region.

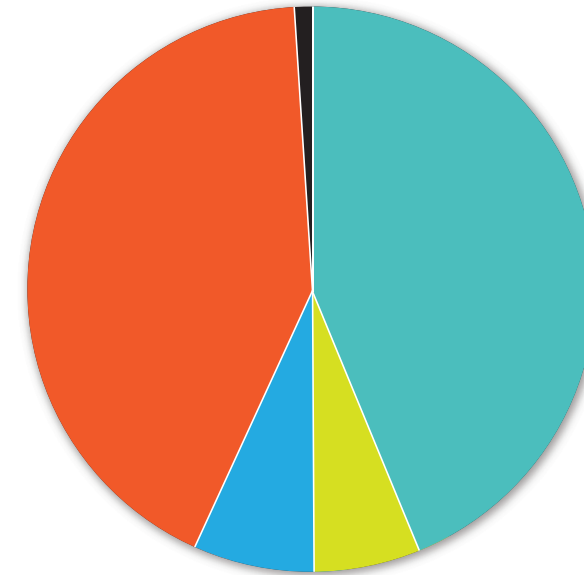
