Strength in Sustainability

BGF's Latest Environmental Projects

> BGF's latest initiatives aim to drive sustainability through four impactful projects.

These efforts span promoting vibrant energy communities, tackling energy poverty, empowering youth with solar and green economy skills, educating on climate adaptation and enhancing Kosovo's energy policies to meet EU standards.

SolarCollab – A Youth-led Energy Transition

is a youth-driven initiative spearheading an energy transition towards accessible renewable energy and empowering green economy opportunities. Within the project, we advocate for breakdown of barriers to renewable energy systems and promoting energy-efficient investments such as prosumers in national level.

The initiatives equip young people with vital skills for green jobs through specialized training programs. Utilizing a peer-to-peer learning model, university students' mentor high schoolers to foster awareness and action towards sustainability.

Decarbonization for Climate Resilience

addresses Kosovo's climate change challenges, particularly those affecting security and regional stability. The project aims to guide policymaking, foster dialogue among key stakeholders, and educate the public on the importance of climate adaptation. Ultimately, the goal is to mitigate climate change impacts in crucial sectors through effective decarbonization.

ReRURAL Renew Rural Areas'

Within the project, our consortium is dedicated to tackling energy poverty in rural Southeast Europe through promoting energy transition and establishing energy communities (ECs). We focus on capacity building among public institutions, potential EC founders, and civil society different activities, with a strong emphasis on engaging youth.

Additionally, we aim to address legislative gaps in Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, and Kosovo to empower communities in combating energy poverty effectively.

RenovAID -Buildings Renovation

aims to improve energy efficiency in buildings in Kosovo and Albania through evidence-based policy recommendations. We collaborate with local and EU partners to train government officials in developing long-term renovation strategies aligned with EU standards.

Addressing energy poverty, we advise on disseminating energy-efficient renovation information and support the establishment of onestop shops for streamlined climate-friendly building upgrades, ultimately aiding Kosovo and Albania in their EU compliance journey.

Project Achievement Update

Energy Transition and Decarbonisation in The Western Balkans

Supported by the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and implemented in partnership with Germanwatch (lead), Belgrade Open School and Eko-svest.

The initiative aims to speed up energy transition and decarbonization in Kosovo, North Macedonia, and Serbia. Its mission is to build strong civil society networks advocating for reforms at national and regional levels, involving academia, the private sector, and labour unions in coal-dependent areas.

The project emphasizes gender equity in tackling the climate crisis and follow a regional strategy to create a collaborative roadmap with clear actions.



1. National Core Group

To create a powerful network of stakeholders to tackle energy transition and decarbonization, BGF formed a national core group. This group consists of nine diverse institutions, including NGOs, academia, business associations, and legal experts, all united to advocate for a just transition.

The core group's primary focus is to drive the upscaling of energy efficiency. Why? In Kosovo, electricity consumption is notably high, particularly in the household sector, which also holds the greatest potential for savings. There are sufficient mechanisms in place to implement impactful measures to address this issue effectively.

2. Phasing in Renewables in North Macedonia, Study Visit

Our visit to North Macedonia aimed to witness the country's energy transformation firsthand. One striking example of the visit was Oslomej, a small village in Kicevo. Once a lignite mine since the 1980s, Oslomej is now a symbol of renewable energy. By 2030, mining will completely stop, replaced by solar panels that already provide enough electricity for up to 5,000 households. This remarkable shift highlights the Western Balkans' transition a renewable energy leader in Europe.



Kosovo Green Action

promotes collaboration among stakeholders to enhance social accountability on climate and energy issues, aligned with the EU-endorsed Green Agenda for the Western Balkans. It aims to ensure social accountability and enable data-driven policymaking in line with the Green Agenda in Kosovo. Furthermore, 'Kosovo Green Action' is the first project from Kosovo to receive the GPSA Grant.

The Balkan Green Ideas program

aims to foster the growth of sustainable local initiatives in the region. It actively promotes green innovation by involving communities in creating environmentally friendly businesses that leverage local resources and community-based markets.

National Highlights 12th Edition

- A total of 171 applications from across the Western Balkans were received to be part of National Green Ideas Competition.
- 4 informational sessions were organized, both on-site and online, attracting 104 participants interested in the program.

Road Map of Social Enterprises


aims to create a supportive environment for social entrepreneurship by developing a digital map, website, and app for networking and sharing knowledge.


